Rescue with English Springer Rescue America, Inc.

as told by Kathy Raidt, ESRA Coordinator

My story of rescue starts in 2001 when one of my customers told me about her lab/retriever mix. Her dog was adopted from a rescue organization and I, at the time, had not heard of rescue organizations except for the ubiquitous Humane Societies. She showed me how to search for a rescue group online and that is when I discovered English Springer Rescue America, Inc. I submitted my application for a b/w female. Little did I know that they are the hardest to find, especially in MN. Well, four months later, the shelter coordinator for ESRA, Jen Yeager, alerted me to a b/w female being available to adopt the next morning at 11:00 AM at Petco in Maple Grove. My husband, Bernie, and I were there at 10:55 AM and immediately saw our dog to be, Lucy. Her foster family had only had her for a week. Lucy and her sister, Jasmine, were given up because of a divorce. The wife could not take care of the children and two dogs. Bernie and I talked with the foster family for a very long time, mainly because we just couldn't stop petting Lucy and also, because the twins in the foster family cried as they realized they were not going to be able to keep their Lucy. We ended the morning with Lucy in tow and our new life together just beginning. We promised the twins that they could visit Lucy any time. As it turns out, the foster mom has been our groomer now for 5 years. She grooms all of our springers, Lucy, Benjamin, Fruffy, our foster springer, and Chester, before he passed away.

Near that same time, Jen Yeager, from ESRA, asked if I would be interested in coordinating MN for ESRA because there weren't any members in MN. I, of course, said "Yes!" What a great opportunity to do something for the springers in MN who can't speak for themselves, for those who are dependent on humans for care, food, shelter, and human companionship. I was eager to learn the "ins and outs" of the rescue organization so I read the Members' Manual and called other members when the first springer to be rescued was brought to my attention.



Abby came to ESRA from Iowa. The small shelter could not find an adoptive family for her. She was 6 years old and had lived her whole life chained outside. She would spin and spin and spin on one paw in order to find a spot to defecate. That is how inhumane her living conditions were. She went through three foster homes and it took several months before the right family found her. Abby's soon to be adoptive mom flew from Alaska to MN to visit Abby. She, of course, fell in love with Abby and she could offer the type of home that a dog dreams about. Abby was adopted that same day and flew with her new forever mom to Alaska.



Her home was on an island not far from Vancouver so Abby was able to run down the beaches and swim in the ocean every day. She also went to work with her new mom and dad. They worked for the forestry department. It doesn't get any better than this! Here is Abby running down the beach at full throttle.

Another success was Buddy. Buddy had Retinal Dysplasia so he was totally blind. He was about 2 years old and was in a shelter in Menomonee, WI. We rescue a lot of springers from WI. The shelter could not find a home fast enough for Buddy because no one wanted a blind dog. I met the lady in Hudson after work and took him to a foster home. Unfortunately, he had made a mess because he had Coccidia, a very contagious parasite so I picked him up and brought him home. Poor Buddy had to be quarantined for several days until the antibiotics worked. He then was fostered by a new foster home back in WI where he stayed for 5 months. It is hard to find the right family for a blind dog but Buddy was lucky. A lady in WI was interested in adopting Buddy. She had a

yellow lab and a seven acre hobby farm. Buddy was adopted into the best home possible. The owner thought that her lab would be able to lead Buddy around the seven acres but the reverse happened. Buddy has become the leader and they play, eat, and sleep together as two best companions.



I could continue with stories about our rescued springers but I'll save them for another edition of the VOX. Thanks.

Brian Schaffer - For doing every little thing that was asked.

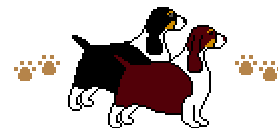
Barb Ciresi - For helping out with registrations.

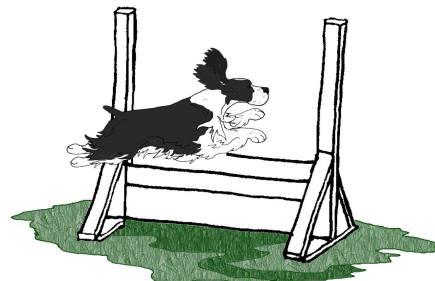
