Committee Reports:

Julie proposed to waive the reading of the notes from the last Board Meeting; all agreed.

Specialty:

Ribbons: Ordered; will be shipped on the 15th to Cyndi. Trophies: Cyndi has purchased, labeled, and tagged nearly all of them. The catalog is on schedule. Kris will do the necessary follow up with Cindy O'Hare. Raffle: All of the items have been purchased and/or received. September 18 Board Meeting Minutes

Board members present: Julie Roberts, Francie Nelson, Jean Dockendorf, B.A. Breese, Cyndi Myhre, Kris Radermacher, Carmen Laing, and Kathy Raidt. Also attending: Kandice Bierle, Jon Pidde

The meeting was called to order by Julie Roberts at 6:50 PM.

Previous Meeting Notes: The meeting notes from the last two months were read and accepted.

Treasurer's Report: B.A. Breese stated that costs of our specialties totaled \$2,194.19. Julie brought the checks for the grooming space rental which totaled \$450.00. Half of the ribbons that we had to order are still left over which we can use at the next Specialty. The board discussed having lunches to be paid by the club members in the next Specialty. B.A. stated that we have \$20,313.71 in our checking account to date.

Membership Report: Kathy Raidt stated that there were no new memberships.

Specialty Show Discussion: Positives and negatives were discussed. Overall, the board was pleased with the shows, and many people pitched in to help. Positive comments from judges and exhibitors were received. Negatives included heat, dirty mats, and loud fans (due to heat). Kris proposed moving the 2009 specialties to May 16th and May 17th at the Anoka County Fairgrounds. After discussion, Kris made a motion to this effect. Francie seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. Kris will contact Alvin Eng to obtain ESSFTA approval to change the date for our Specialties. Jon Pidde and Jean Dockendorf will be co-chairs for Obedience and Rally. Kathy Raidt will be Chairperson and Kris Radermacher will be Co-Chairperson for the Specialties. Cyndi Myhre will be Trophy Chairperson. We also have extra Isle of Dog certificates which can be used at our next Specialties. Judges were discussed and they will be finalized at our next Specialty Meeting. Kathy Raidt will call Mary Ann Alston for her availability. Our website has the official results for the specialties. Pictures for the newsletter were discussed and black and white photos are acceptable. It was proposed to write a Thank You note to Rick Radermacher for helping us unload and reload the heavy mats for the Specialty.

Educational Seminar: Kris stated that the contract has been sent to the U of M for the seminar on April 18th and 19th. Dr. Jesus Rosales – Ruiz and Kellie Snider will be the presenters. The titled of the seminar is *Shaping Away Canine Aggression: Constructional Aggression Treatment*. The proposed cost for the two days will be \$190.00 which includes lunch for non-members. Club members will pay \$155.00 if they are not working the event and working club members will pay \$140.00. Non-profit and Junior Handlers will pay \$150.00. The CE credits will be available to veterinarians who attend. We pay \$50 as a one time fee.

Fun Match: It will be held on November 23, 2008, at C & E. Cyndi Myhre and B.A. Breese will co-chair it. Jean will find a judge for obedience and Cyndi will find a judge for conformation. This will also be our general membership meeting so we may vote on the by-laws. Again, it will be a potluck meeting.

AKC Outreach Requirements

The AKC requires each club to fulfill an educational outreach program at least once a year. The Pet Expo will be submitted as our annual educational program to the public during 2008.

Calendar Drawings: Our 2010 calendar drawing will be held at the November fun match; our 2011 calendar drawing will be held at the 2009 banquet in March.

National Specialty Show: A donation for the breakfast was requested and the board approved giving ESSFTA \$100.00. B.A. Breese will mail a check. Francie proposed a basket made of denim jeans full of MN items. It was requested that members bring MN items to the next meeting for Cyndi and B.A. to take to the National Specialty.

Nominating Committee: It is comprised of 1 board member and 2 non-board members. B.A. will chair this committee and she will choose 2 non-board members plus an alternate. The committee's report will be presented at the November general membership meeting, where nominations from the floor can be accepted.

Operating Guidelines: Francie and Kris have been working on this; Francie presented a re-drafted version of the document that is divided into categories. "Old Dog" or Cognitive Dysfunction Syndrome

Has Fido started to seem confused out in the yard? Does Fifi seek attention less often? Does it seem like your beloved 11 year old Springer isn't able to sleep well at night? Or maybe your older dog seems to forget to ask to go outside to potty? While some of these behavior changes can be related to age it can also be a sign of Cognitive Dysfunction Syndrome.

Cognitive Dysfunction Syndrome (CDS) can be described as the physical and chemical changes that have occurred in an older dog's brain. These include a reduction in the overall brain mass as well as the accumulation of plaques and infiltrates that are similar to those seen in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease. These changes appear to increase the amount of free radicals in the brain which can be neurotoxic. In addition, the overall reduced health of an elderly patient can compromise the blood flow to the brain.

DISHA has been used to describe some of the common signs of cognitive dysfunction – Disorientation, alterations in Interactions, alterations in Sleep-wake cycles, Housesoiling and alterations in Activity. It is important to note that very few clients mention any of these behavioral changes in their older patients to their veterinarian. One study showed that 28% of dogs 11-12 years of age and 68% of 15-16 year old dogs showed at least one sign of cognitive dysfunction. This is in sharp contrast to another study that showed only 7% of the owners reported these changes to their veterinarian. You can review the questionnaire for CDS at www.cdsindogs.com and be sure to mention any of the concerns to your veterinarian.

If you believe your pet has signs of CDS you will want to get a complete physical exam and minimum database of bloodwork and urinalysis done. Other tests may be recommended by your veterinarian and all health issues should be evaluated before treatment of CDS can be started. After evaluating your senior pet's overall health, the following may help to stop, or at least slow down, cognitive decline:

Diet:

Supplementing the diet with antioxidants can help reduce the toxic effects of free radicals. One option is to feed the Hill's b/d diet with is supplemented with antioxidants; cofactors and essential fatty acids which are all fancy words for the stuff that can help reduce free radicals. If you feed a home diet you can also accomplish this by supplementing with things like Vitamins E and C, beta carotene, selenium and a number of flavonoids and carontenoids from fruits and vegetables. However, a home diet should always be one formulated by a veterinarian and researched appropriately (start with Dr Pitcarin's Complete Guide to Natural Health for Dogs and Cats) and changes should be reviewed with your veterinarian.

Drugs:

Selegiline (ie. Anipryl*) has been licensed by the FDA in the United States to control the signs of cognitive dysfunction in the dog. Its mechanism is not completely understood but appears to enhance neurotransmitters in the brain as well as may decrease the free radical load. Studies have shown that 69%–75% of the dogs improved in at least one clinical sign after one month of therapy. Other drugs have been used in Europe and may become available in the future.



Behavior and Environmental:

"Use it or Lose it"! It is very important to continue to enrich your senior pet's activity and training, play, exercise, and toys are as important a factor as diet and drugs in slowing the cognitive decline of your dog.

These modifications may dramatically improve the cognitive decline in your pet but it is unlikely that your pet's changes will be completely resolved. It does appear that early recognition of the problem can prevent or at least slow the decline so remember to mention all behavioral changes to your veterinarian.

TCVESSA By-Law Updates

Dear TCVESSA Members,

After submitting our new bylaws to the AKC we received a letter back with a few revisions that they required. Below is the summary of these changes:

Article II Membership

Section 2. Classifications of Membership

We added: <u>Individual members enjoy all club privileges including the right to vote and</u> hold office.

SECTION 4. DUES

Deleted: Membership dues shall not exceed \$50.00 per year, payable on or before the 1st day of January of each year.

Added: Membership dues shall be set annually in the month of October by the Board of Directors, not to exceed \$50.00 for Individuals, \$75.00 per year for Families, or \$25 per year for Juniors; payable on or before the first day of January of each year. During the month of October, the Secretary shall send to each member, by E-mail or U.S. Mail, a statement of his/her dues for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE III. MEETINGS AND VOTING

SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, and 4

(In regards to where meetings may be held)

Deleted: in, or within 25 miles of, the Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul.

Added: in the greater Minneapolis/St. Paul area.

SECTION 4.

Deleted: Any action that might be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting if done in writing or E-Mail and approved unanimously by all Directors.

SECTION 5.

In regards to voting:

Added: including life members.

Article IV. Directors and Officers

Section 2.

a) The President is an <u>may be an</u> *ex officio* member of all committees, <u>except the Nominating Committee</u>.

Article V. THE CLUB YEAR, ANNUAL MEETING, ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. ORGANIZATIONS YEAR

<u>Changed: The official year</u> shall begin immediately at the conclusion of the Annual Meeting, at which officers are elected. on April 1st.

SECTION 3. Newly elected officers shall take office on April 1st of each year.

ARTICLE VII. DISCIPLINE

SECTION 1. AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB SUSPENSION

Changed: Any member who is suspended from the <u>any</u> privileges of The American Kennel Club automatically shall be suspended from the privileges of this club for a like period.

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS

SECTION 3.

Added: The By-Laws may be amended by a <u>secret</u> 2/3 vote of the members present and voting at any regular or special meeting called for this purpose, provided the proposed amendments have been included in the notice of the meeting sent by U.S. Mail or E-Mail to each member at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting.

Also attached is the entire document. We will be voting on these revision at our November Match/Meeting.



SHAPING AWAY CANINE AGGRESSION:

Constructional Aggression Treatment ("CAT" for Dogs)

Presented by Dr. Jesús Rosales-Ruiz & Kellie Snider April 18-19, 2009 St. Paul, MN

Saturday (April 18)

Research done at the University of North Texas suggests that classical treatments for aggression may have us all barking up the wrong tree. Dr. Jesús Rosales-Ruiz and Kellie Snider have devised a shaping-based, operant approach to treating aggression in clients' homes that is producing stronger and much faster results than classical positive desensitization and counter conditioning.

They show that aggression is learned behavior. Their research results also show that the Constructional Approach can change the consequences for the behavior: turning aggression into friendliness.

At UNT, they explored whether aggression could be reduced by the contingent with-drawal of an aversive stimulus, introduced at low intensities. They ended up with dogs that both tolerated, and were friendly with, the strangers they were once aggressive toward. The dog solicited interaction from the formerly aversive stimulus he was previously attacking. He wasn't just ignoring the stimulus or turning to his owner in its presence, either. He was just not worried about it any more.

Sunday (April 19)

This session continues exploring the UNT training procedure, using video and live demonstration. Other topics include the poisoned cue, functional analyses of aggressive behaviors, and stimulus control.

The CAT procedure uses negative reinforcement because positive reinforcement may achieve stillness in the face of aversive stimuli, but rarely produces friendliness toward the aversive stimulus.

This is a great write-up on this subject in the May 2008 issue of Whole Dog Journal.
