Read the Breed – Standard, That Is.


With our upcoming May Specialty, I was reading some historic articles about the origin of breed standards and the English Springer Spaniel standard in particular. Did you know that the ESS standard is among the longest, if not the longest, written standard among AKC recognized breeds? At 2000 words, it describes all aspects of the Springer, from appearance to temperament. The lengthiest part of the Springer standard is the section on the head. At 542 words, no detail of the skull, muzzle, stop, eyes, ears, nose, teeth or bite is without considerable description.

An article in the February, 2016 Canine Chronicle written by William Given asserted: *The primary responsibility of a breed standard should be to list, define and describe the elements of type by the breed which identifies it from the other 189 recognized breeds. This summary of breed type can be and very often is expressed in a single paragraph, and the reader begins to form a mental picture of the dog as a whole with respect to the functional history which may apply to the origin and development of the breed.*

With that in mind, consider the opening paragraph of the English Springer Spaniel standard:

The English Springer Spaniel is a medium-sized sporting dog, with a compact body and a docked tail. His coat is moderately long, with feathering on his legs, ears, chest and brisket. His pendulous ears, soft gentle expression, sturdy build and friendly wagging tail proclaim him unmistakably a member of the ancient family of Spaniels. He is above all a well-proportioned dog, free from exaggeration, nicely balanced in every part. His carriage is proud and upstanding, body deep, legs strong and muscular, with enough length to carry him with ease. Taken as a whole, the English Springer Spaniel suggests power, endurance and agility. He looks the part of a dog that can go, and keep going, under difficult hunting conditions. At his best, he is endowed with style, symmetry, balance and enthusiasm, and is every inch a sporting dog of distinct spaniel character, combining beauty and utility.

Do you have a mental picture of that “perfect” Springer? Keep reading – your standard, that is, to bring more texture and completeness to that picture. And you’ll be ready for our May Specialty!

TCVESSA Board Meeting Minutes

January 18, 2018

President, Liz Pike, called the meeting to order via conference call. The minutes from the December 7, 2017 were approved.

Alice received information and links from the AKC about club development as well as media coverage for the specialty. Alice is to send these to Liz. Alice inquired about the club's Minnesota State Incorporation status as well as the IRS reporting responsibilities. Julie is to check on these.

Plans are on target for the coming May specialty. Judges are secured. Liz will as Kathy Raidt about helping with judges' hospitality and transportation. Everyone agreed to have ESSRA have a raffle table present. Two-three larger raffle items are to be found. Julie offered a Ruth Dehmel piece that needs framing. A VISA gift card was agreed upon. Entry fees were raised for this year's show. They have not been raised for 5 years? Expenses for electricity were discussed. It was decided to raise the electric fee to cover the electrical expense. (To what?) We talked about using Panera again for lunches. The possibility of using salads and half lunches were brought up. It was decided to get box lunches for the judges. Everyone agreed to place an advertisement for the specialty through Joan Beck in the upcoming Springer Show Case and to list our agility trial in the add also.

Carmen asked if we wish to supplement the cost per plate for the banquet this year. It would be \$20 a plate per person?

Ideas were tossed around to help improve club member involvement at our events. Liz is going to make up a punch card that can be used to thank people for volunteering. Things like discounts or free entry fees were discussed. It was decided to present this idea and the cards to members at the banquet and enact it after the banquet or for 2019?

Jean Dockendorf is retiring from the ribbons for the specialty as well as the club website. Carol Hathaway and Joan Beck have expressed an interest in the website. These vacancies need to be filled.

Other business included finalizing any grooming clinics Janice Johnson may want to offer. Janice would like to use the Canine Cabin owned by Rachel Lucas.




Alice reported that Joan Beck is looking into the use of a park in Cottage Grove for a springer get together. The park area is owned by the city of Cottage Grove.

Lastly, Janice Johnson has purchased 10-13 large glass Springers that could be used as specialty prizes or award trophies or raffle items. Liz will see them in person.


The next meeting was scheduled for Thursday, February 15th at 7:15 p.m. via conference call.

There have been many changes in regulations by the AKC that go into effect this year. Please take the time to go to the AKC website and familiarize yourself with these changes to avoid future misery! Most notable are:

January 9, 2018 – There are changes in the Behavior and Misconduct Regulations

May 1, 2018 – There are many significant obedience regulation changes. This includes both regular and nonregular classes and pertains to more than just the long sit and long down exercises.

May 16, 2018 – The new point schedule for conformation goes into effect.
